Thank you for your recent application for a Civil Aviation medical certificate. It was noted that since 1997 the following condition has been placed on your medical certificate, "11. Special Condition: Colour vision waiver issued under ICAO Standards 6.2.4.1 and 1.2.4.8 paragraph A, B and C. No limitations on night flying required", as you had previously not met the pass requirements for Ishihara, Farnsworth Lantern and Practical Lantern testing.

Unfortunately you do not meet the colour vision standard as laid down in the Civil Aviation Safety Regulations (CASR) Part 67 and pilots with results similar to yours now have the following conditions placed on their medical certificates.

6. Not valid for ATPL operations

13. Limited to flights conducted inside Australian Territory

To align your certificate with current practice, I am sorry to say that I have to convey to you that your certificate will now have the above conditions placed on it.

It will no doubt be an understatement to say that you might not be pleased to have the changed conditions on your certificate, especially given the amount of time that has passed since 1997 and the number of flying hours that you have accumulated since then.

However, Regulation 67.150(6)(c) of the CASR provides that a person who has failed testing under regulations 67.150(6)(a) or (b) may demonstrate compliance with the colour perception criterion by correctly identifying all relevant coloured lights in a test, determined by CASA, that simulates an operational situation.

CASA has determined the Colour Assessment and Diagnosis (CAD) test to be an appropriate test for the purposes of regulation 67.150(6)(c).

Should you wish to be further assessed under the colour perception criterion it will be necessary for you to undertake the CAD test.



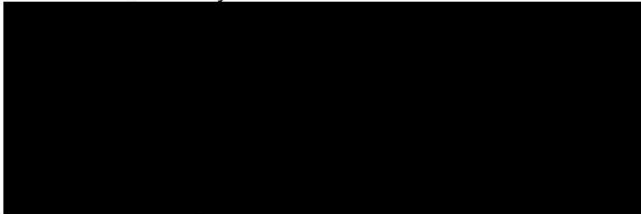

At the present time, CASA is aware that CAD testing in Australia is only offered by Dr Elizabeth Livingstone, Designated Aviation Ophthalmologist at the Livingstone Eye Clinic in Sydney [(61-2) 9362-5820]. Please note appointments are necessary and there will be a fee charged. Any expense incurred will be your responsibility.

When you attend for your test please take this letter with you and some form of photographic identification containing a signature. If you have any further inquiries regarding the test you may contact the Aviation Medicine Section on 1300 4 AVMED (28633).
